Step 1: Back Up Your Important Data

Save Personal Files

Use OneDrive, Google Drive, or external drives to back up Documents, Pictures, Videos, Desktop files, and Downloads folder.

02

Export Application Data

Export browser bookmarks, email data (Outlook PST files), game saves, and application settings you want to preserve.

03

Protect Secondary Drives

Disconnect or safely note secondary drives to prevent accidental formatting during installation.

04

Verify Backups

Double-check that all critical files are accessible and complete before proceeding with installation.

Step 2: Prepare Windows 11 Installation Media

What You'll Need

- A working Windows PC with internet connection
- USB flash drive (minimum 8GB, will be erased)
- 30-60 minutes for download and creation

 **Pro Tip:** Use a USB 3.0 drive for faster installation speeds. Label the drive clearly for future use.



Download Media Creation Tool

Visit Microsoft's official website and download the Windows 11 Media Creation Tool. Always use the official source for security.



Create Bootable USB

Run the tool and select "Create installation media." Choose USB flash drive and let it download the latest Windows 11 ISO.



Verify Creation

Ensure the USB drive contains the Windows setup files and is properly formatted as a bootable device.

Step 3: Boot from Installation Media and Start Setup

1

Insert USB and Restart

Plug your bootable USB drive into the target computer and perform a complete restart.

2

Access BIOS/UEFI

Immediately press the BIOS key during startup (usually F2, DEL, F12, or ESC—check your PC manufacturer's instructions).

3

Set Boot Priority

Navigate to the Boot menu and set your USB drive as the first boot device. This ensures your PC boots from the installation media.

4

Save and Launch Setup

Save BIOS changes and exit. Your computer will reboot and Windows Setup will launch automatically from the USB drive.



Step 4: Format the System Drive (C:) During Installation

Choose Custom Installation

When prompted with installation type, select "Custom: Install Windows only (advanced)" for full control.

Select System Partition

Identify your primary system partition (typically Drive 0 Partition 1 or the largest partition on your main drive).

Format the Drive

Click "Format" to completely erase all data and prepare a clean slate for Windows 11 installation.

Confirm and Proceed

Review your selection carefully, confirm the format operation, and begin the installation process.

Critical Warning

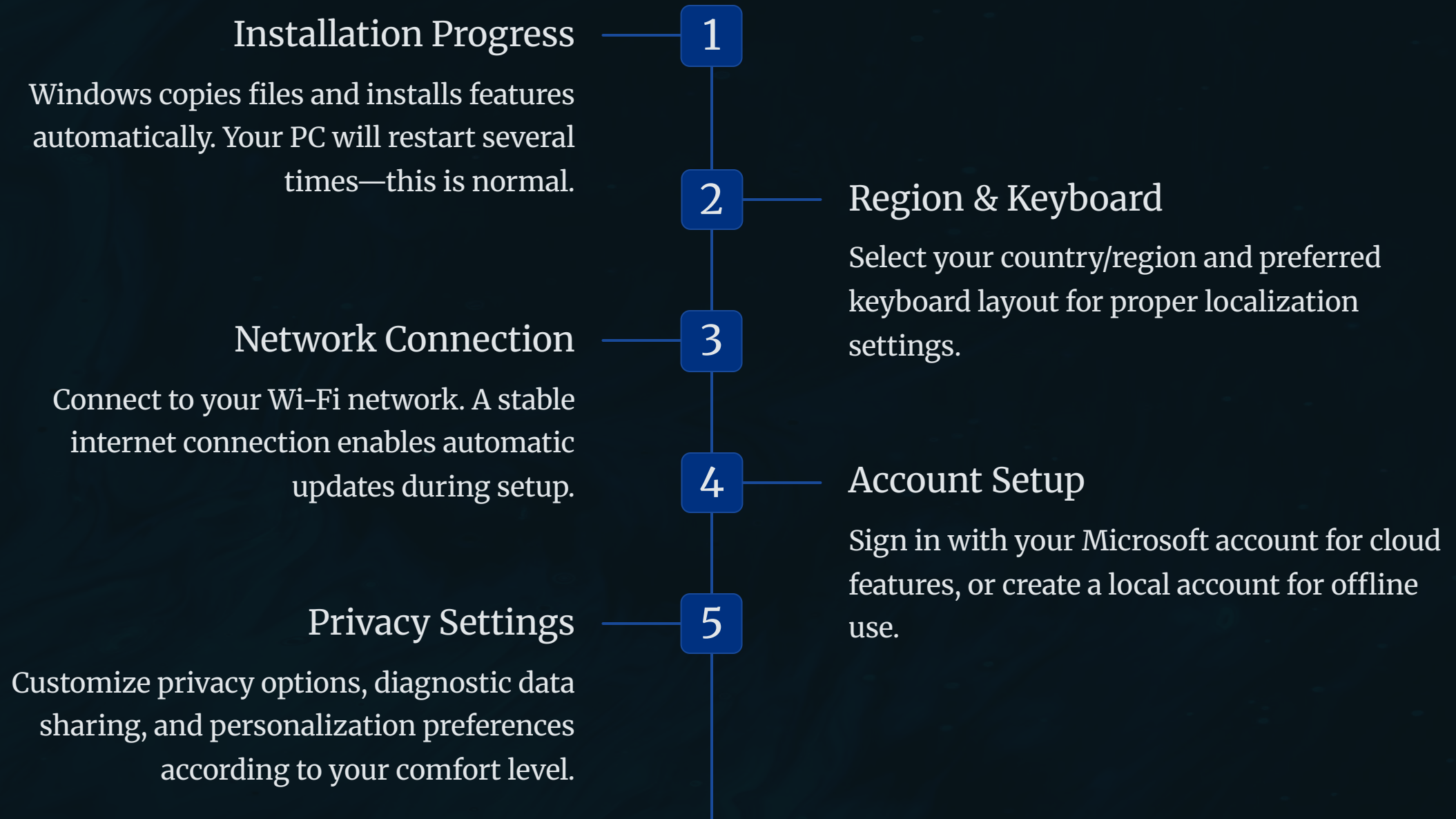
Formatting permanently deletes **all** files on the selected partition. This action cannot be undone.

Ensure your backups are complete and verified before clicking Format!



Step 5: Complete Windows 11 Installation

The installation wizard will guide you through configuring your fresh Windows 11 system. This process typically takes 20–45 minutes depending on your hardware.



Step 6: Post-Installation Setup and Driver Installation

Essential First Steps

1 Run Windows Update

Immediately check for updates to install the latest security patches, feature updates, and automatic driver installations.

2 Install Critical Drivers

Visit your PC or motherboard manufacturer's website to download specific drivers for chipset, graphics card, audio, and network adapters.

3 Restore Your Files

Copy back your backed-up documents, photos, and personal files from external drives or cloud storage.

4 Reinstall Applications

Install essential software, productivity tools, browsers, and applications you use regularly for work or entertainment.



❏ **Driver Priority:** Focus on chipset and graphics drivers first, as these have the biggest impact on system stability and performance.



Tips for a Smooth and Safe Reinstallation

Keep Power Connected

Ensure your laptop or desktop stays plugged in throughout the entire installation process to prevent interruptions that could corrupt the system.

Handle BitLocker Carefully

If BitLocker encryption is enabled, disable it beforehand or securely note your recovery key. You'll need it to access encrypted data later.

Hardware Upgrade Prep

When changing major components like motherboard or CPU, be prepared to reactivate Windows. Link your license to your Microsoft account beforehand.

Complete Clean Slate

Use the "Remove everything" option only when you want to erase all partitions and data—ideal for selling or repurposing your PC.
